

Please accept this letter as an introduction to The Gynecological Carcinosarcoma (GCS) Project, a non-profit organization founded in 2015 by Diane Redington, a nurse practitioner and our friend, who following her diagnosis with carcinosarcoma in 2015 set out to find a cure for this disease. As you know, gynecological carcinosarcoma (or MMMT) is an extremely rare malignancy that has received little in the way of dedicated research or funding. The GCS Project was founded to change that. Thus far, we have raised more than \$350,000, which has been directed for genomic and epigenomic research on carcinosarcoma tissue samples. We are in the middle of raising another \$300-\$400,000 to support a clinical trial this year.

We also hope to provide patients with this disease a means to connect with each other and with expert clinicians around the world. To that end, we have begun to identify a network of physicians and institutions considered Centers of Excellence. These Centers have a disproportionate experience with this disease and offer patients and their families access to research opportunities and certain expertise in clinical management. The centers found at the end of this letter are all actively accepting patients with this disease and are excellent resources for clinicians and patients.

One such physician whom you may know is Dr. Michael Birrer, MD, PhD. Formerly of MGH, he is now the Director of the Comprehensive Cancer Center at the University of Alabama. He has been a leader in the field of carcinosarcoma and has directed much of the groundbreaking research we are supporting.

Given that Dr. Birrer has one of the few clinics in the country dedicated to the care of women with carcinosarcoma, he has offered to consult with colleagues and share his expertise. Please do not hesitate to reach out to Dr. Birrer on behalf of your patients.
